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COBALT IN JUNE 2010

Preliminary data for 2010 indicate that U.S. cobalt consumption during the first half of 2010 was 4% higher than that consumed during the first half of 2009, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. U.S. cobalt consumption during the quarter ending June 30, 2010, was slightly lower than that consumed during the quarter ending March 31, 2010.

The amount of cobalt contained in U.S. imports of cobalt metals and chemicals was 71% higher during January through May 2010 than that imported during the same period in 2009. The amount of cobalt contained in U.S. exports of unwrought cobalt and chemicals during January through May 2010 was 14% higher than that during the same period in 2009.
