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IRON ORE IN DECEMBER 1997

U.S. mine production of iron ore in December 1997 was slightly lower than that of November 1997, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. Shipments increased by 3.1% and mine stocks decreased by 17.1%. Consumption and trade data for December 1997 will be included in a subsequent report.

Year-to-date production through December was 1.0% higher than that of the same period in 1996. Shipments were 1.6% higher. Based solely on monthly data, 1997 consumption, at 71.8 million metric tons, was slightly greater than that of the previous year.
