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Iron and Steel Scrap, Monthly

IRON AND STEEL SCRAP IN OCTOBER 1976

Returns from 78% of reporting consumers representing 95% of total scrap consumption, indicated that consumption of iron and steel scrap in October on a daily average basis was 5% below that in September, according to the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. Compared with September data, daily average production and net receipts were down 7% and 2%, respectively, and stocks at the end of the month were essentially unchanged.

Exports of ferrous scrap during the month were 12% below those for September 1976 and 6% below those for October 1975. Japan was the largest importer of U.S. scrap, taking 27% of the total exported in October 1976. The next largest importers were the Republic of Korea and Canada, which received 24% and 14%, respectively.

The Iron Age composite price for No. 1 heavy melting steel scrap (Chicago, Pittsburgh, and Philadelphia) at the end of October was \$62.83 per long ton, up 7% from the price of \$58.50 at the end of October 1975.

Pig iron production and consumption on a daily average basis during the month were both down 4% from those of the previous month. Stocks of pig iron were essentially unchanged during October compared with those at the end of September 1976.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports of iron and steel scrap totaled 604,500 short tons in October compared with 687,021 tons in September. Exports of pig iron during October totaled 3,994 tons and 2,841 tons in September. Imports of scrap totaled 26,475 short tons in October compared with 28,283 tons in September. Of the scrap imported during October, 24,494 short tons came from Canada and 1,981 tons from other sources. Imports of pig iron totaled 22,127 short tons in October and 54,826 tons in September. In addition to the foregoing imports of pig iron during October, there were 2 tons of sponge iron, valued at \$1,539 imported, all of which came from Canada.
