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Iron and Steel Scrap, Monthly

IRON AND STEEL SCRAP IN MAY 1977

Returns from 81% of reporting consumers representing 97% of total scrap consumption, indicated that consumption of iron and steel scrap in May on a daily average basis was 2% above that in April, according to the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. Compared with April data, daily average production and net receipts were up 2% and down 1%, respectively, and stocks at the end of the month were down 2%.

Exports of ferrous scrap during the month were 6% above those for April 1977 and 41% below those for May 1976. The Republic of Korea was the largest importer of U.S. scrap, taking 29% of the total exported in May 1977. The next largest importers were Spain and Canada, which received 20% and 13%, respectively.

The Iron Age composite price for No. 1 heavy melting steel scrap (Chicago, Pittsburgh, and Philadelphia) at the end of May was \$64.50 per long ton, down 21% from the price of \$81.83 at the end of May 1976.

Pig iron production and consumption on a daily average basis during the month were unchanged and up 5%, respectively, from those of the previous month. Stocks of pig iron decreased 1% during May compared with those at the end of April 1977.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports of iron and steel scrap totaled 471,056 short tons in May compared with 445,406 tons in April. Exports of pig iron during May totaled 9,725 tons and 3,804 tons in April. Imports of scrap totaled 42,651 short tons in May compared with 80,298 tons in April. Of the scrap imported during May 41,389 short tons came from Canada and 1,262 tons from other sources. Imports of pig iron totaled 36,380 short tons in May and 13,607 tons in April. In addition to the foregoing imports of pig iron during May, there were 20 tons of sponge iron, valued at \$13,742 imported, all of which came from Canada.
