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Iron and Steel Scrap, Monthly

IRON AND STEEL SCRAP IN JUNE 1978

Returns from 75% of reporting consumers representing 95% of total scrap consumption, indicated that consumption of iron and steel scrap in June on a daily average basis was 4% below that in May, according to the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. Compared with May data, daily average production and net receipts were unchanged and down 7%, respectively, and stocks at the end of the month were unchanged.

Exports of ferrous scrap during the month were 35% above those for May 1978 and 27% above those for June 1977. Japan was the largest importer of U.S. scrap, taking 39% of the total exported in June 1978. The next largest importers were the Republic of Korea and Italy, which received 15% and 13%, respectively.

The Iron Age composite price for No. 1 heavy melting steel scrap (Chicago, Pittsburgh, and Philadelphia) at the end of June was \$74.50 per long ton, up 21% from the price of \$61.50 at the end of June 1977.

Pig iron production and consumption on a daily average basis during the month were unchanged and down 2%, respectively, from those of the previous month. Stocks of pig iron increased 2% during June compared with those at the end of May 1978.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports of iron and steel scrap totaled 785,698 short tons in June compared with 581,589 tons in May. Exports of pig iron during June totaled 527 tons and 1,245 tons in May. Imports of scrap totaled 55,448 short tons in June compared with 126,946 tons in May. Of the scrap imported during June 46,629 short tons came from Canada and 8,819 tons from other sources. Imports of pig iron totaled 98,942 short tons in June and 38,026 tons in May. There were no imports of sponge iron during June.
