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Iron and Steel Scrap, Monthly

IRON AND STEEL SCRAP IN OCTOBER 1978

Returns from 71% of reporting consumers representing 93% of total scrap consumption, indicated that consumption of iron and steel scrap in October on a daily average basis was 4% above that in September, according to the Bureau of Mines, U.S. Department of the Interior. Compared with September data, daily average production and net receipts were up 3% and 2%, respectively, and stocks at the end of the month were down 3%.

Exports of ferrous scrap during the month were 129% above those for October 1977 and 17% above those for September 1978. Japan was the largest importer of U.S. scrap, taking 40% of the total exported in October 1978. The next largest importers were the Republic of Korea, and Italy, which received 11% and 10%, respectively.

The Iron Age composite price for No. 1 heavy melting steel scrap (Chicago, Pittsburgh, and Philadelphia) at the end of October was \$74.50 per long ton, up 17% from the price of \$63.83 at the end of October 1977.

Pig iron production and consumption on a daily average basis during the month were both up 2% from those of the previous month. Stocks of pig iron decreased 6% during October compared with those at the end of September 1978.

Exports of iron and steel scrap totaled 976,818 short tons in October compared with 834,347 tons in September. Exports of pig iron during October totaled 10,949 tons and 893 tons in September. Imports of scrap totaled 50,891 short tons in October compared with 70,428 tons in September. Of the scrap imported during October 47,771 short tons came from Canada and 3,120 tons from other sources. Imports of pig iron totaled 40,629 short tons in October and 87,743 tons in September. In addition to the foregoing imports of pig iron during October, there were 63 tons of sponge iron, valued at \$46,254 imported, of which 62 tons came from Canada, and 1 ton from Sweden.
