# **MANGANESE IN APRIL 2006**

On a gross-weight basis, reported consumption of manganese ore containing 35% or more manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 30,400 metric tons (t) in April 2006, which was an 11% increase compared with that in March 2006, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. This figure increases to 32,800 t when estimates for annual respondents are added on the basis of 2005 data. Corresponding industry stocks of ore at the end of the month were 263,000 t, which includes an estimate for annual respondents on the basis of 2005 data. This was a 6% decrease from that of March 2006.

The following comparisons of trade data were made on the basis of manganese content (table 1). The data for March 2006 tabulated in this report indicate that the total exports of 1,720 t were 37% higher than those of the prior month, owing to an increase in exports of ferromanganese. Manganese imports were 52,300 t, which was a decrease of 35% compared with those of February 2006. This decrease was primarily attributable to decreases in manganese ore and silicomanganese imports.
