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MANGANESE IN JULY 2006

On a gross-weight basis, reported consumption of manganese ore containing 35% or more manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 32,100 metric tons (t) in July 2006, which was a 3% decrease compared with that in June 2006, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. Corresponding industry stocks of ore at the end of the month were 197,000 t, which was an 11% decrease from those at the end of June 2006. These data include estimates for annual respondents on the basis of 2005 data. The following comparisons of trade data were made on the basis of manganese content (table 1). The data for June 2006 tabulated in this report indicate that the total exports of 854 t were 32% higher than those of the prior month, owing primarily to increases in exports of ferromanganese and manganese ore. Manganese imports were 79,400 t, which was an increase of 49% compared with those of May 2006. This increase was primarily attributable to increases in manganese ore imports.
