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MANGANESE IN SEPTEMBER 2006

On a gross-weight basis, consumption of manganese ore containing 35% or more manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 33,600 metric tons (t) in September 2006, three times those of the revised amount (10,900 t) in August 2006, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. Corresponding industry stocks of ore at the end of the month were 203,000 t, which was an 11% decrease from the revised amount (229,000 t) at the end of August 2006. These data include estimates for annual respondents on the basis of 2005 data.

Domestic consumption of manganese ore during the third quarter of 2006 was 76,400 t, which was a 22% decrease from that during the second quarter of 2006 (revised to 98,000 t), and

an 11% decrease from the revised third quarter of 2005 (85,600 t). Domestic consumption during the first 9 months of 2006 was 260,000 t, which was 12% lower than the revised consumption for the first 9 months of 2005 (295,000 t).

The following comparisons of trade data were made on the basis of manganese content (table 1). The data for August 2006 tabulated in this report indicate that the total exports of 874 t were 92% less than those of the prior month, owing primarily to decreases in exports of ferromanganese. Manganese imports were 60,100 t, which was a decrease of 28% compared with those of July 2006. This decrease was primarily attributable to decreases in manganese ore imports.
