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MANGANESE IN NOVEMBER 2008

Preliminary reported data (gross weight) for November 2008 indicate that consumption of manganese ore containing 35% or more manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 24,200 metric tons (t), according to the U.S. Geological Survey. This was slightly less than that reported consumed in October 2008. Manganese ore consumption during the first 11 months of 2008 was 277,000 t. This was 67% of the net manganese ore imports during the same period (413,000 t), and slightly less than the revised amount consumed during the same period in 2007 (280,000 t). Industry stocks of ore at the end of November were 100,000 t, which was slightly less than those at the end of October 2008. These data include estimates for annual respondents on the basis of 2007 data.

Data for U.S. imports and exports for October 2008 are published in this issue. On a contained-weight basis, U.S. manganese ore plus dioxide and manganese ferroalloys plus metal imports were 85% lower and 4% higher, respectively, than those in September 2008. U.S. manganese ore plus dioxide and manganese ferroalloys plus metal imports during the first 10 months of 2008 were 20% lower and 21% higher, respectively, than those during the same period in 2007 (table 1).

On a contained-weight basis, U.S. manganese ore and manganese ferroalloys plus metal exports for October 2008 were 34% higher and slightly lower, respectively, than those in September 2008. U.S. manganese ore and manganese ferroalloys plus metal exports during the first 11 months of 2008 were double and 12% less than, respectively, those during the same period in 2007 (table 1).
