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MANGANESE IN MARCH 2015

Preliminary data for March 2015 indicated that domestic consumption of manganese ore containing more than 20% manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 51,700 metric tons (t) (gross weight). This was a 10% decrease compared with the amount consumed in February 2015 (57,100 t). Manganese ore consumption during the first 3 months of 2015 was about 175,000 t, 45% more than the amount consumed during the same period of 2014 (120,000 t). This year-over-year increase was primarily the result of resumed production at Felman Production, LLC's silicomanganese production facility in Letart, WV, which started in July 2014.

Industry stocks of ore at the end of March 2015 were estimated to be 220,000 t, which was 41% more than the amount at the end of February 2015 (156,000 t).
