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MANGANESE IN MARCH 2017




Figure 1. Monthly domestic consumption and imports of manganese (Mn) ore from March 2015 through March 2017. Sources: U.S. Census Bureau and U.S. Geological Survey.

Preliminary data for March 2017 indicated that domestic consumption of manganese ore containing more than 20% manganese, exclusive of that consumed at iron and steel plants, was 40,700 metric tons (t) (gross weight). This was 54% more than the amount consumed in February 2017 (26,400 t) (fig. 1). Manganese ore consumption during the first 3 months of 2017 was 93,500 t, which was about 4% less than the amount consumed during the same period in 2016 (96,900 t). Industry stocks of ore at the end of March 2017 were 134,000 t, slightly more than that at the end of February 2017 (133,000 t).

There were no U.S. imports of manganese ore in March 2017 (fig. 1, table 5).




Figure 2. Average monthly spot prices for manganese (Mn) ore delivered to China from March 2015 through March 2017. Source: CRU Ryan's Notes.

In March 2017, the average monthly spot-market prices for manganese ore deliveries to China decreased compared to those

in February 2017. The average spot prices were 3.27 dollars per metric ton unit, 36%–39% grade and 4.12 dollars per metric ton unit, 44% grade (fig. 2, table 1). These were less than those in February 2017—29% for the 36%–39% grade and 23% for the 44% grade. However, they were higher than those in March 2016—5% for the 36%–39% grade and 37% for the 44% grade—and were approaching those of March 2015.
