PLATINUM-GROUP METALS IN NOVEMBER 2018

Imports for consumption of platinum-group metals (PGMs), including waste and scrap, were 19,600 kilograms (kg) in November 2018, representing decreases of 5% each compared with imports in October 2018 and November 2017. The leading import sources for PGMs into the United States were, in decending order, South Africa, Russia, and Germany (tables 3, 4). For January through November 2018, imports of palladium, platinum, and PGM scrap were 85,400 kg, 54,100 kg, and 36,900 kg, increases of 15%, 12%, and a decrease of 90%, respectively, compared with imports in the similar period in 2017.

Prices




Figure 1. Engelhard unfabricated average monthly prices for palladium, platinum, and rhodium from November 2016 through November 2018. Source: Platts Metals Week.




Figure 2. Indexed Engelhard unfabricated average monthly prices for iridium, palladium, platinum, rhodium, and ruthenium from November 2016 through November 2018. Prices are indexed to November 2016. Source: Platts Metals Week.

Compared with the prior month, the Engelhard average November prices increased by 5% for palladium, increased slightly for platinum, remained essentially unchanged for iridium and ruthenium, and decreased slightly for rhodium. Compared with November 2017, the November 2018 average prices increased by 103%, 74%, 50%, and 14% for ruthenium, rhodium, iridium, and palladium, respectively. The price of platinum decreased by 9% (figs. 1, 2; tables 1, 2). On November 30, palladium reached its highest price in decades, continuing an increasing trend since mid-August.

Industry News

On November 1, PolyMet Mining, Inc. (PolyMet) announced that it had received a mining permit from the State of Minnesota for its NorthMet copper-nickel-PGM project in the Duluth Complex. The permit would allow PolyMet to construct and run open pit mines with an expected 20-year mine production of nearly 50,000 kg of precious metals (PolyMet Mining, Inc., 2018).

Also on November 1, Anglo American Platinum Ltd. announced the acquisition of its joint-venture partners' shares of the Mototolo operations in South Africa (Anglo American Platinum Ltd., 2018).

On November 2, Republic Metals Corp., a domestic precious metals refinery based in Florida which produced PGMs, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection (Bullion Exchanges, 2018).

Government and Legislation

In a budget statement, the Government of Zimbabwe announced plans to construct a base and precious metals refinery that would process platinum material mined within the country. To promote refining within Zimbabwe, the Government will place a 5% tax on exported platinum concentrates beginning in 2019 (Thomson Reuters Corp., 2018).
